I gave up my office some time ago, and what small things have come in, mostly minor things old clients wanted, I have taken care of from here. I have m y drawing table in my bedroom, and do my drawing here.

You mentioned Mr Gain for doing the work. He has been engaged in war work for over a mear, and changed over his machinery to that specialized work and refused all other work as he could not do it now. However, I have not seen him for some months, but I can phone him and find out. In case he cannot do it, I have another man here who can do it, so that would work out; but it takes forever to get anything done, and will be so for some time to come.

When I left the old home at Bellefontaine street, I was forced to destroy all my records of long years of architectural work, yours, among the others. But I believe I can work it out for you.

You mention just shelves in the bay; if you can send me the measurement I ask for above, I believe this will be all I need. Regarding the finish, thestain I used in your house - I believe I can get again if the work there has not changed too much. But as a rule these stains changed in time very little.

I will make a small scale drawing when I get the measurement and let you look at it before I go far,

so you will get what you have in mind.

There would be the question of transportation from here up there. But in the mean time I can look into this and find out what can be done about it.

My dear Mrs Gould:

I received your latter of the 23 of April. It gave me the needed data and I finihed my drawing and submitted it to the cabinet makers Swapsen and Petersen, address is 96 No. Sunny Slope Ave., Pasadena. They have no Douglas Fir, and it is out of the market, because the government is needing it. I looked around for some other wood, and found he had some gum wood, which I think would look all right in the room, because it is a build in feature and is a brown color but not quite so red ish as the douglas fir. His estimate, using the gum wood is \$95.00. This includes the making and finishing, and starting it on its way in Pasadena. He did not know, nor do I what is the best way to ship it; but we both thought the center case could, and would be made complite; the two outer cases would be fitted and sent worked out and fitted together, and sent in the nockdown. I have not included a shoe mould on the floor, because I believe it best to omit it around the cases. cutting out the carpet against the cases.

This would <u>not</u> allow of giving the touch of blue as you said was on the other woodwork. I suggest that this wood would look best <u>without</u> the blue tint. Would this be satisfactory to you? I am enclosing a small piece of gum wood that is finished just with oil.

I had arranged some time ago to visit my son in Pittsburg, California, and purchased ticket, etc., so I have settled everything with Swansen and Petersen, so they can go on with the work and ship it to you. If you know of a company that ships to Ventura let him know who it is, please.

I have a long distance call in to talk with you and give you the data, and will instruct him before I leave, after which if you wanted information, you can communicate with them. They have a blue-print of the shelves.

Should you want to write me, my address in Pitts-burg is 497 East 12th St., Pare of Wm S. Gree ne.

This will confirm our phone talk, and I will give the orderbefore I leave.

My own charge for this work is \$17.00.

The man who sets it will make the joint in the tops on the job; allowance having been made for this.

Arranged as I now have it, I feel the work will go on all right.
